Export Controls and Economic Sanctions

Maya advises both US and non-US clients on how to comply with and understand US laws and regulations related to the export and re-exports of goods, software, services, and technology. In particular, Maya advises clients on the complexities of the Export Administration Regulations (EAR), International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR), the Office of Information and Communications Technology and Services (OICTS), and the Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) sanctions and embargoes.

Maya's practice thus far has focused on:

- Assisting clients file advisory opinion requests before the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS)
- Responding to subpoenas issued by various government agencies
- Assisting clients submit comments in ICTS rulemaking proceedings
- Advising clients on the application of the OICTS Rule on Connected Vehicles

Current active matters include the representation of a Canadian investor in a tax dispute brought against Mexico under the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), Chinese investors against the Kingdom of Cambodia under the China-ASEAN Free Trade Agreement, Israeli investors against a Southern African State, and a Southeast Asian State in an ICC infrastructure dispute.
