Pat is an advocate for clients embroiled in high-stakes litigation. He assists a range of clients, but frequently represents clients in the health care industry. In that capacity, he works with clients in all phases of litigation: negotiating directly with government attorneys in investigations; trying cases to verdict as first chair; and arguing appeals before federal appellate courts and state supreme courts.

Pat helps clients confront and overcome potential liability within a complex and ever-changing statutory and regulatory framework, which includes the False Claims Act, Anti-Kickback Statute, Stark Law, Affordable Care Act, Medicare Secondary Payer Act, Mental Health Parity Act, and antitrust law. This work features the most pressing issues in health care, like drug shortages, off-label promotion, speaker programs, pricing and reimbursement, and patient assistance programs. In these cases, Pat coordinates with executives and outside consultants to limit liability and avoid business disruption as much as possible.

Pat also represents health care providers in efforts to seek reimbursement from payers and recovery from others in managed care litigation. This representation includes everything from high-profile, bet-the-company style litigation involving numerous patients, plans, payers, and networks, to smaller-scale, confidential arbitration. In these payer disputes, Pat works with health care consultants, actuaries, and other expert witnesses to prove up the provider's case.

Outside of the health care space, Pat has worked with a variety of clients in a broad array of litigation and investigations. This work includes trade secret and employee mobility issues, real estate and land use, government contracting, and a variety of other commercial disputes. Pat is particularly well-versed in data-driven matters, which often require working with AI and forensic experts to uncover evidence, manage high-volume e-discovery, and valuate complex damages claims.

Before entering private practice, Pat clerked for Special Master Lisa Hamilton-Fieldman at the US Court of Federal Claims and served in the Office of Staff Counsel for the US Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit. He also interned for the Honorable Samuel Der-Yeghiayan of the US District Court for the Northern District of Illinois.

Investigations

Recent representative investigations with which Pat has been involved include:

- Represented pharmaceutical manufacturer in bet-the-company investigation in response to a subpoena issued by the Department of Justice, presenting repeatedly to government attorneys regarding potential liability under the False Claims Act, Anti-Kickback Statute, and antitrust law.
- Represented active pharmaceutical ingredient (API) supplier in settlement negotiations during pending bet-the-company litigation over Medicare reimbursement rates, presenting to government attorneys in ability to pay negotiations.
- Represented government contractor in response to Department of Defense investigation and related litigation under the False Claims Act, culminating in no findings of liability and dismissal of suit. See Irazola v. Fors Marsh Grp., No. 1:19-CV-554, 2019 WL 3294900 (E.D. Va. June 28, 2019).

Trial Litigation

Recent representative trials with which Pat has been involved include:

- Represented high-net-worth individual in ERISA trial and subsequent appeal, securing favorable testimony via cross-examination that was quoted by US Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit in reversal of \$70M verdict. See Dunne v. Elton Corp., 2024 WL 4224619, at *11 (3rd Cir. Sep. 18, 2024).
- Represented generic pharmaceutical manufacturer in commercial contract dispute against branded pharmaceutical manufacturer, successfully opposing motion for summary judgment and leading to favorable settlement. See Apotex Inc. v. Otsuka Pharmaceutical Co., No. 2022-0291-MTZ, 2022 WL 10029846 (Del. Ch. Oct. 14, 2022).
- Represented industry-leading dialysis provider in bet-the-company litigation against claims repricer, successfully opposing motion for summary judgment.
- Represented industry-leading government contractor in trade secret litigation, successfully
 examining and cross-examining forensic experts and arguing motions en route to multiple courtordered forensic examinations, fee awards, orders granting motions to compel documents under
 the crime-fraud exception, and, ultimately, default judgment for spoliation.

- Argued municipal tax appeal before the Supreme Court of Connecticut on behalf of nonprofit
 housing provider, successfully persuading Court, in unanimous decision, to recognize nonprofit's
 real property as tax-exempt. See Rainbow Housing Corp. v. Town of Cromwell, 340 Conn. 501
 (2021).
- Retained as appellate counsel to represent small business owner convicted of immigration fraud before US Court of Appeals for Ninth Circuit, successfully persuading Court to vacate sentence, despite appellate waiver in plea agreement. See United States v. Guntipally, 735 F. App'x 432 (9th Cir. 2018).
- Represented industry-leading dialysis provider in arbitrations against payers and health care networks
